ECF's Community-Led Grantmaking Centering Community Voice and Choice

WHAT IS COMMUNITY-LED GRANTMAKING?

At ECF, we believe those closest to the challenges should help decide how funding is used. Our communityled grantmaking model shifts decision-making to local residents and leaders with lived experience.

Each grant cycle, diverse committees of 10–12 volunteers— many from programs like Leadership Evanston and Advocates for Action— review proposals and recommend funding based on what our community truly needs. Their top-rated proposals are then approved by our Board.

ECF'S MODEL OF COMMUNITY-LED GRANTMAKING

This community-led model is informed by a blend of best practices sourced from trust-based philanthropy and participatory grantmaking. The cornerstones of our community-led grantmaking approach:
